PBIS “Cool Tool” Lesson Plan

School Wide Expectations:

Be Ready
Be Responsible
Be Respectful

Lesson Topic: Help others/ Classroom

Purpose of the Lesson:

1. To show that you care.
2. It feels good to help others.
3. If you needed help, you would want someone to help you too.

Teaching Examples:

Ask, “What does being respectful and helping others look like?”

1. You see someone with his/her hands full, so you hold the door open.
2. Your friend drops a pencil off of their desk and you pick it up and hand it back to them.
3. Your classmate forgot their crayons at home and you let them borrow your crayons.

Check for understanding: Ask, “What did you do that was respectful?”, “How do you think the students felt?”, “How do you think the teacher felt?”, and “What good things happened because you were respectful and helped someone?”

Student Activities/Role Play:

1. Have student role-play a scenario: A friend is crying because of a bad grade, how can you help?
2. Have small group/classroom discussion about a time when they helped others or others helped them and how they felt about it.
3. Brainstorm and list the different times that they can help in the classroom.

Follow up/Reinforcement Activities:

1. Verbal praise when a student helps others or helps the teacher.
2. Reinforce with “Buzz Bucks”.
