School-Wide Expectation: Be Respectful

Name of the Skill: Respect 1

**Note to Teacher:** Lesson to be split into 2 sessions of 20 minutes each

## Purpose:

Students are expected to respect themselves. People who respect themselves will earn the respect of others. People who do not respect themselves cannot expect others to respect them. This lesson will help students understand many ways that they can respect themselves at school.

## **Teaching Examples:**

#### **Student Activities:**

- A. Explain the purpose of the lesson.
- B. Ask the class: "What does it mean to respect yourself in school?" Record responses on the board.
- C. Administer the Respect Yourself Quiz to your class
- D. Grade & Discuss the Respect Yourself Quiz
  - "How is/isn't the student respecting self?"
  - "What could have been done differently?"
  - "Are there others ways this student could have respected self?"
- E. Have students make a list on the board of other specific ways they could show themselves respect (not necessarily school-related).
- F. Ask the class: "What does it mean to respect yourself in school?" Record responses on the board.
  - Being safe
  - Doing homework
  - Listening to directions
  - Solving problems peacefully
  - · Being on time to school
  - Studying
  - Following directions
  - Doing your best
  - Being prepared

#### Follow-Up/Reinforcement Activities:

- Make a habit of noticing when students are respecting themselves (especially in the next couple of days.)
- Give verbal praise to students who are respecting themselves.
- Reward some students who are respecting themselves by giving them JG Star Bucks.

# Respect Yourself Quiz

**Directions:** On the line next to each scenario, write "Yes" or "No". Samantha was on the playground during recess. She decided to go visit with Sally.
