SCHOOL-WIDE EXPECTATION: Respect in the bathroom

NAME OF THE SKILL: Respect all things in the bathroom

### PURPOSE OF THE LESSON / WHY IT'S IMPORTANT

1. Safety and self-respect
2. Cleanliness and hygiene

### TEACHING EXAMPLES:

1. I am in the bathroom and think it would be fun to swing on the stall door because I've seen other kids do it. But, I remember that I need to respect all things and property in the bathroom. I decide to use the bathroom appropriately and go back to my classroom.
2. I am in the bathroom and think it would be fun to squirt or spray water onto the mirrors, floor, or the person standing next to me. But, I decide that's not a good choice and I do what I need to do and go back to class.
3. I am in the bathroom and in a hurry. I want to make a 3-point shot in the garbage can to save time. Instead, I walk to the trash and dump it in and walk out. I know I did the right thing.

### KID ACTIVITIES / ROLE PLAYS:

1. Role play "get in and get out"
2. Discuss importance of privacy in the restroom

### FOLLOW-UP / REINFORCEMENT ACTIVITIES:

1. Verbally praise students
2. Reward students for efficient and clean bathroom use.
