## PBIS “Cool Tool” Lesson Plan

### School Wide Expectations:

- Be Ready
- Be Responsible
- Be Respectful

**Lesson Topic:** Take Turns/Playground

### Purpose of the Lesson:

1. It is important to know when it is your turn and when it is not your turn.
2. Everyone needs a chance to talk or participate.
3. Friends are respectful of someone’s right to take a turn.

### Teaching Examples:

Ask, “What does waiting your turn and being respectful look like?”

1. You are on the swing and someone else asks to have a turn. You talk about it and you decide to let them have a turn.
2. Everyone is in line to go down the slide. The slide is your favorite. You get in line and wait to take your turn.
3. Everyone is riding the tricycle you want to have a turn. You ask for a turn on your favorite tricycle and you wait.

Check for understanding: Ask, “What did you do that was respectful?”, “How do you think the students felt?”, “How do you think the teacher felt?”, and “What good things happened because you were respectful and waited your turn?”

### Student Activities/Role Play:

1. Practice taking turns with playground equipment.
2. Role-play a playground game that involves kids taking turns.
3. Brainstorm and list the different times that you take turns at recess.

### Follow up/Reinforcement Activities:

1. Verbal praise when a student finishes their work.
2. Reinforce with “Buzz Bucks”.
